QUOTE FOR MEDITATION:

"The text says that 'the Lord God formed adam [pronounced a-DAHM] from ha-adamah.' In Hebrew that's a pun. It's very difficult to take a pun and translate it into another language. Traditionally the verse is translated, 'the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground.' You lose the pun when you do that. Furthermore...I find nothing in the story about human sexuality until God puts that creature [the earthling] to sleep and performs surgery on that creature and out of that creature comes two creatures. There is no word in the story about sexuality until the woman appears. It is when the woman (isha) appears that the man (ish) appears. Sexuality is simultaneous for male and female."

REALM UPDATES: We have successfully moved all membership and giving data to our new directory system in Realm. If you haven't yet logged in, just reach out to the church office and we'll send you login information. Next week, an automated email will be going out notifying you about a privacy setting change. This simply means that the church directory is now accessible and viewable by church members and active participants. It is the same setting that was in place with Church Office Online, our previous directory. Your information is secure and accessible only within the Friends Church database behind a login.
