The Longest Night: “Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted” (Matthew 5:4). The Christmas season tends to be marked by happiness and expressions of good cheer. It is a time for family and friends to gather, and for congregations to worship in a spirit of joy. However, this time of joy-filled expectation often overshadows the pain and loneliness many experience during this season. Longest Night or Blue Christmas services are held on or close to the Winter Solstice, December 21. Retired United Methodist Church minister Daniel Benedict writes, “There is an interesting convergence for this day as it is also the traditional feast day for Saint Thomas the Apostle. This linkage invites making some connections between Thomas’ struggle to believe the tale of Jesus’ resurrection, the long nights just before Christmas, and the struggle with darkness and grief faced by those living with loss.”

One: This candle represents our suffering and the suffering of the world.
In the light of God’s love, we claim God’s gift of truth.
There is no need to hide or deny. God welcomes us as we are.

All: Incline your ear, O Lord, and answer me, for I am poor and in need.
(Psalm 86:1)

**O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel,
That mourns in lonely exile here, until the Child of God appear;
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.**

One: This candle represents our suffering and the suffering of the world.
In the light of God’s love, we claim God’s gift of lament.
We recognize our wounds and cry out to God.
We accept God’s invitation to express every feeling and question.

**All: My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?
Why are you so far from helping me,
from the words of my groaning?
O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer;
and by night, but find no rest.**
(Psalm 22:1-2)
