Fifth Sunday in Lent

Lent, from the Latin quadragesima, 'fortieth,' is a penitential season of preparation for Easter com memorating the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the desert and enduring temptation before beginning his public ministry. In Western churches, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, six and a half weeks before Easter, and is marked by fasting, prayer, charity, and self-reflection on our discipleship with Christ.

LENTEN MORNING MEDITATION, MARCH 19: On Tuesdays during Lent, you are invited to the Friends Church sanctuary to start your morning with centering meditation. At 7:30am on Tuesdays, Mar. 19th and 26th, we gather for a brief introduction, followed by silent meditation, and follow-up conversation as time permits. Start to finish, this lasts between 35 and 45 minutes, hopefully allowing for those of us with work, school, and other obligations to get where we need to be on time. We are excited about this series of morning meditations that will bring us together in self- and community-preparation for Easter.

"BROKEN": REAL LIFE AND REAL FAITH, MARCH 19: On March 19th, we will gather in the sanctuary at 6:30pm to watch episode 5 of the 2017 BBC drama series "Broken" and have conversation about how faith and real life intersect. Even if you can't make every week, you are welcome to attend, and can view the episodes you might have missed on Amazon Prime or Britbox. LENTEN MIDDAY RECITAL SERIES, MARCH 20: Join us for a series of Lenten Midday Recitals, featuring the talents of our wonderful musicians of Friends Church! Bring your own lunch for fellowship beginning at 11:30 am, and stay for a 20-30 minute program, beginning at 12:00, of music selected by our gifted musicians. A variety of music - sacred, musical theatre, classical, and pop - will be performed each week. The last recital is March 20. We hope you can take time out from these busy weeks to relax and enjoy great music.

THEOLOGY ON TAP, MARCH 21: At 6pm on March 21st, Theology on Tap (T.o.T.) is held at KinderHill Brew Lab, 800 S. Bryan Ave. T.o.T.'s informal discussions bring our lives more in tune with God's will and way as we get to know each other better beyond church walls. The venue has an assortment of great beers on tap. You don't need to be fond of beer to join us, nor do you have to be 21 or older. Non-alcoholic beverages are available, and minors are welcome, as are four-leggeds. Cheers, and amen!

B.Y.O.F. FOR PALM SUNDAY, MARCH 24: On Palm/Passion Sunday, we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Like many churches, we celebrate this story by waving palm branches and singing in our worship services. But to really get into the story in our context, what do we have nearby that we would wave in celebration today? Maybe you have yaupon lining your yard, oak trees, or Texas wildflowers. For Palm/Passion Sunday, March 24, you're encouraged to BYOF (bring your own fronds) to church and wave whatever you may have in your yard (except, of course, poison ivy). And if you would prefer to stay with traditional palms, we will have those available as well.

MAUNDY THURSDAY, MARCH 28: Maundy Thursday is the day in Holy Week when we remember the new command Jesus gives his followers, to "love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." It is traditionally observed with foot- or hand-washing, and communion may also be observed. Instead of a formal worship service, the sanctuary will be open for two hours that evening with the pastors present to offer foot- or hand-washing as well as communion, and to pray with those who come to the church during that time. Chris Hoffman will offer piano music to carry us into that upper room with the disciples where Jesus shared a final meal with them before washing their feet. We hope you will come by to join in this special, come-and-go observance of Maundy Thursday any time between 6 and 8pm

GOOD FRIDAY, MARCH 29: On Good Friday, March 29, at 7:30 pm, the Friends Choir will be joined by a Chamber Orchestra, performing Paul Mealor's "Stabat Mater." The evening will begin with Scripture and Prayer, and will conclude with this incredibly moving Masterwork, which is a hymn to the Virgin Mary that portrays her suffering during the crucifixion of Jesus. Paul Mealor is a Welsh composer who had been commissioned to write music for the Royal Wedding of Prince William and Princess Catherine, and most recently for the Coronation of Charles III and Camil-la...and has agreed to write an anthem for the Friends Choir in honor of Chris Hoffman's upcoming 20th anniversary (June 2026). All are welcome to attend this Worship Service and be immersed in this musical experience.
