GETTING CONNECTED AT FRIENDS

CHRISTMAS EVE AT FRIENDS CHURCH – HAND BELLS, COMMUNION, & CAROLS BY CANDLELIGHT: Beginning at 6:30pm on Christmas Eve, the hand bell choir presents a short pre-service concert of holiday music to usher in the mystery and wonder of the Christ Child's birth. Then at 7pm, the Christmas Eve service of communion and carols by candlelight is offered. The service will also be live-streamed.

HOLIDAY BREAK: Sunday school for children and youth will take a break for the holidays. We won't meet from December 18th-January 1st, and classes will resume on January 8th. Merry Christmas, and we're looking forward to the new Sunday school year!

11AM SERVICES ONLY ON CHRISTMAS & NEW YEARS: Christmas Day and New Years Day fall on Sundays. For those sleepy holiday mornings, Friends Church will offer only one service at 11am. Two services on Sundays will resume in 2023 on January 8th at 9am and 11am.

ANGEL TREE DELIVERY TO CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES OFFICE: It took 2 pickup trucks, 2 more SUVs, and six people to deliver all of the presents for the 65 children who Friends sponsored for Christmas this year. The folks at that office were ready for us with more volunteers waiting to help us unload. The next step in the journey will be for the caseworkers to deliver the presents to the homes of the children. Thanks to all of you who felt the call to share with these children and to bring joy into their world. Gas and grocery gift cards are still being accepted. These gift cards are distributed by our pastors to people in our community who stop by Friends for emergency assistance. You may drop gift cards by the church office or put in the gift box under the Christmas tree in the church narthex.

THE LONGEST NIGHT SERVICE, 12/21: Longest Night or Blue Christmas services provide space for all who might be experiencing loneliness, struggling with depression, or going through loss in whatever form during the holiday season. Different life circumstances make joviality difficult for many in our congregation and community. Recognizing this reality and the need for safe, inclusive space where solace and healing can breathe, a Longest Night Service will be offered at Friends Church at 6:30pm on Winter Solstice, Wednesday, Dec. 21. The service will move from shadows to illumination as we pray, sing, share scriptures, light the Advent candles, and hold space for one another and all needing comfort on the longest night of the year.

LAST NIGHT IN “ADVENT CONSPIRACY” SERIES, TUES, 12/20: The word ‘Advent’ means “coming” in Latin, as in the coming nativity of Jesus. While the word ‘conspiracy’ might sound cringey given the state of our world, it actually derives from the Latin word ‘conspirare,’ which means “to breathe together.” To conspire is “to act in harmony toward a common end.” This Tuesday night, Dec. 20, we gather at Friends Church one last time in this four-part series toward the common end of preparing for Jesus’ birth. Even if you have not joined us in previous weeks, you are welcome to attend. We will watch a brief video from the Advent Conspiracy resources on the evening’s topic, “Love All,” and share informal conversation, followed by a time of prayer. Join us at Friends for the last in our series of four Advent Midday Luncheon Recitals, Wednesday at noon, Dec. 21. Bring your lunch and enjoy fellowship, followed by performances of Advent and Christmas music performed by talented members of Friends Church’s music ministry.

LAST MORNING MEDITATION FOR ADVENT: This Tuesday morning, you are invited to the Friends Church sanctuary to start your morning with centering meditation. At 7:30am on Dec.20, we gather for a brief introduction, followed by silent meditation, and follow-up conversation as time permits. This lasts between 35 and 45 minutes, hopefully allowing for those of us with work, school, and other obligations to get where we need to be on time. This series of morning meditations has been bringing us together in self- and community-preparation for the coming of Emanuel, God-With-Us, on Christmas. All are welcome.

PASTOR DAN LEADS MLK BOOK STUDY AT LINCOLN CENTER: Coretta Scott King wrote that "if there is one book [my husband] Martin Luther King, Jr. has written that people consistently tell me has changed their lives, it is *Strength to Love*." At 6:30pm on the Wednesday evening after MLK Day, January 18, 2023, the Lincoln Center offers an informal study of Dr. King's 1963 book, *Strength to Love*, that Coretta Scott King says, "best explains the central element of [his] philosophy of nonviolence: His belief in a divine, loving presence that binds all life." Our own Pastor Dan will lead the book study and discussion that is free and open to the public.
