Twenty-Third Sunday after Pentecost, All Saints Day

All Saints Day, also called All Hallows Day, Hallowmas, or Feast of All Saints, in the Christian Church, commemorates all the saints of the church, both known and unknown, who have entered into God's marvelous light (I Peter 2:9). It is celebrated on November I in the Western churches and on the first Sunday after Pentecost in the Eastern churches.

PSALM FOR MEDITATION: Psalm 107:1-7, 33-37, NRSV

O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever. Let the redeemed of the Lord say so, those he redeemed from trouble and gathered in from the lands, from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.
