Ordinary Time can be understood in terms of the living out of Christian faith and the meaning of Christ's resurrection in ordinary life. It may be referred to as the "green season," as green is the liturgical color for this period of time in the church year.

RHAG'S NEW WEBSITE: The Reproductive Health Access Group (RHAG) is proud to present our new website (https://www.friends-ucc.org/rhag) and Introduce our first major project--providing FREE three-month supply of birth control (Opill)--contactless with no strings attached--available to those who for any reason are not able to purchase over-the-counter contraceptives. The "RHAG Bags" are located in the new brown cabinet in the all-gender restroom. Each Bag contains the Opill supply, a few condoms, two pregnancy tests and an info sheet explaining how to continue to receive free birth control after the first three months.

SUPPORT THE FRIENDS YOUTH GROUP GARDEN PROJECT: Following their environmental justice trip to Denver, the Friends Youth Group decided they wanted to bring what they learned back home and create a community garden.
