Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost, World Communion Sunday

The first Sunday in October is World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with followers of Jesus throughout the world. World Communion Sunday, observed by several Christian denominations, promotes unity and ecumenical collaboration by focusing on an observance of the eucharist.
